Marisa could see that our choir was in for a unique musical and religious experience such that she could no longer resist joining the choir. Even though it would mean sacrificing many other activities to make it possible. Her choice was the right one which has not only lead to great musical fulfillment, but also to the solidifying of many wonderful friendships.

I came with my children on Christmas Eve and never left. Beautiful music, kind people, uplifting messages.
