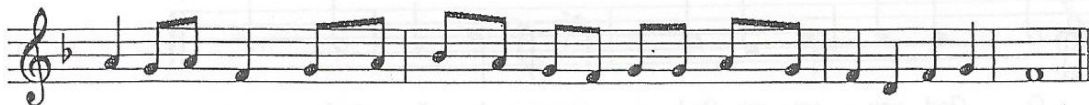
The First Lesson: Isaiah 1:10-18

Upcoming Trinity Forums

November 6 – “Hijacking the Holocaust: The One True Adventure of the Jewish Indiana Jones,” Martha Wexler

Menachem Youlus captivated audiences with his tales – thrilling adventures of crisscrossing Europe, rescuing sacred Torah scrolls that had survived the Holocaust. Dubbed the “Jewish Indiana Jones,” he claimed to have found these holy relics in a mass grave, at a concentration camp site, hidden behind church walls and in monastery basements. Dozens of congregations and donors purchased his Torahs. A feature in the Washington Post Magazine shined a light on those stories and led to Youlus’s indictment for mail and wire fraud. Martha Wexler, one of two journalists who reported the magazine exposé, will discuss the con and the deeper questions it raised about why so many educated, intelligent people fell for it. Martha Wexler is a long-time radio journalist reporting on Europe and the former Soviet Union. She worked two decades at the Voice of America Russian Service and Worldwide English desks, before moving to NPR where she worked for a decade as Senior editor at Morning Edition and Weekend Edition.

November 13 – “The Historical Development of the Eastern Orthodox Churches: From Unity to Diversity?” Dr. Mary Cunningham

Dr. Cunningham is Honorary Associate Professor of Historical Theology at the University of Nottingham (and also John Chaffee’s cousin-in-law). She is a practicing Orthodox Christian, belonging to the Greek Diocese of Thyateira in Great Britain. She has published books and articles on the Virgin Mary in Byzantium, preachers and their audiences, and the history and practices of the Byzantine Church.

November 20 – “Religious Practices and Belief in the Modern Orthodox Church: Saints, Icons, and the Role of Women.” Dr. Mary Cunningham
