# GUIDELINES FOR MARRIAGES At Trinity Memorial Church



This set of guidelines is for couples who wish to be married at Trinity Memorial Church, Binghamton, New York.

Congratulations on your engagement! May God richly bless you and your families as you prepare for your wedding day and for many years of marriage to come. The clergy and people of Trinity Memorial Church support you with their prayers.

We make every effort to ensure your day is uniquely special. However, there remain certain guidelines that are not negotiable. Trinity Memorial is an Episcopal church and is therefore bound by Episcopal canons (laws and rules) as well as guidelines adopted by this parish.

#### According to the canons of the Episcopal Church:

- At least one of you must be a baptized Christian;
- At least two witnesses besides the officiating clergy must be present;
- The marriage must conform to the laws of Broome County, the State of New York and the canons of the Episcopal Church, which require
  - both parties must understand that Holy Matrimony is a sacramental, lifelong covenant, and sign a document to this effect (the Declaration of Intention);
  - o both parties must be acting freely without fraud, coercion or mental reservation;
  - o the clergy must have a t least 30 days notice before the service is to take place (a longer period will be necessary if one of the parties has been divorced);
  - o the clergy shall conduct pre-marital instruction with both of you, or else make sure that another qualified person has done so;

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- o if one of you have been divorced, permission from the bishop is required to conduct the wedding, with a form to be filled out by both of you and a recommendation by the clergy;
- o the clergy can at any time decline to perform the wedding.

### Regarding the bride and groom:

- You both need to complete a simple factual application. A copy is attached.
- If a prenuptial agreement is in effect or contemplated, the clergy needs to be aware of its details at the time of application.

#### Regarding the date of the wedding:

- You both must meet the clergy and sign the Declaration of Consent before a date can be set. Thirty days is the minimum notice; more may be necessary. If one of you is divorced, more time will be required.
- The time for premarital counseling needs to be scheduled early in the application process. We require at least for (4) sessions of one hour each; more may be necessary.
- If one of you has been divorced, the bishop's permission to perform the marriage must be secured before the date becomes final.

#### **Regarding the ceremony:**

- The wedding will normally take place in the church.
- The parish clergy will perform the service. Arrangements to include other clergy in the service must be made through the parish clergy.

- *The parish clergy are in charge* of the service. Any wedding consultant needs to be able to take directions from them.
- *The marriage license and checks* should be presented to the office a WEEK in advance of the ceremony.
- A wedding is a *public event*, and parishioners are understood to be welcome to attend the service (though the reception may require an invitation).
- *Communion for the congregation* is appropriate if both of you are baptized and planning to receive communion. Anyone who perceives God's call to receive Communion is welcome at the altar. Communion will not be performed for only a select few.
- *Music*: The parish organist will play for the service and make any arrangements for other musicians to participate. Final decisions about appropriate music rest with the clergy and organist.
- *Flowers*: The clergy will guide you in the use of flowers and any other decorations. The florist should be in touch with the main office to determine when the church will be available for decorations. If a <u>runner</u> is to be used for the processional, it should be provided by the florist, and the clergy should be informed at the latest, at the rehearsal.
- *Unity Candles*: If you desire to light a Unity Candle during the ceremony, please notify the clergy before the rehearsal. You must provide your own. Please, purchase high quality beeswax candles. Candelabras are available as are pew candles. There is an extra charge to have these installed and removed. You remain responsible for the candles, for either the pews and/or the candelabra.
- *Photography/Videography*: The photographer/videographer needs to cal the parish office as soon as they know they will be handling the wedding. The office will send them detailed instructions (a copy is attached) and the clergy will work closely with them to ensure that you get the pictures you want without disturbing the participants or violating the sanctity of the occasion. Members of the congregation will not be allowed to take any flash photos during the service.

#### Fees and Honoraria:

- All fees and honoraria should be given to the clergy for distribution to the appropriate people.
- A member of the church is never required to pay for the use of the church for a sacramental service.
- It is customary to make an offering to the Rector's Discretionary Fund in thanksgiving for the clergy's services. This donation will be used to meet needs in the parish or community.
- The organist's fee is \$200.00 and is payable at the rehearsal.
- The sexton should be paid \$125.00 is payable at the rehearsal. If extra work is incurred by the strewing of birdseed or petals or pew candles or candelabra are requested then \$20 extra should be added.
- Clergy from another church or parish whom you wish to participate in the service should be given a minimal honorarium of \$75 to \$100 and their travel expenses.
- There is a charge of \$50.00 for the church office to produce a basic service bulletin.
