## **2024 Downtown Thanksgiving Food Challenge**

City, state, and county officials are teaming up with CHOW and Binghamton University for the 2024 Downtown Thanksgiving Food Challenge. The challenge asks community members and government employees to donate non-perishable foods to support local families in need.

All next week, donation barrels will be located at the Binghamton State and County Office buildings, Broome County Sheriff's Office, Binghamton City Hall, University Downtown Center, and Koffman Incubator. Last year, almost 14,000 meals were donated to families in need.

“A report by the Department of Health at the beginning of the year said that one out of four Broome adults reported being food insecure in the last year. Another report by the State Council said that Broome County had the highest, the fastest growing child poverty rate in the state,” Director of CHOW Les Aylesworth said. “So when you take those two ideas together, it shows that we have a lot of folks aren't getting ready for something and that's what this is all about, to make sure those people get fed.”

## **Responding to Hurricane Oscar and Power Outages in Cuba**

Episcopal Relief & Development is working with the Episcopal Church of Cuba to respond to Hurricane Oscar, and the mid-October power grid failure that continues to impact the entire island.

On October 18, following weeks of intermittent grid outages, ten million people lost power. On October 20, during the blackout, Hurricane Oscar made landfall, flooding and damaging the island's eastern side, and killing seven people. People in the Guantanamo and Baracoa areas had little warning that Oscar was coming because the ongoing power outages badly affected communication systems. Church leaders surveyed the impacted areas and found 82 homes had completely collapsed, 1300 had partially collapsed and over 100 families' appliances were destroyed or washed away.

In response to Hurricane Oscar and the ongoing power outages, Episcopal Relief & Development is working with the Episcopal Church of Cuba to provide food, hygiene products, fans, rechargeable lamps and supplies for home repairs.
